1) Select the Encoder + Media Selector from your desktop.




2) Once the TV Screen Opens, Right Click on the Small Space Bar between the Channel Selector Buttons



3) Select the Channel Suite Manager.




4) Once the Channel Suite Manager opens, select the Sources tab.



5) Once the Source screen opens, select the appropriate input on the encoding card (Select Composite for VHS, and S Video for DVD).




6) Select your media source, assign it a Name and Description. Then Save. (Ex: Name = VCR, Description = Zenith $\sqrt{BV713}$).




7) To set up your Local Channel Listing select Analog Source.


Make sure the Broadcast/Cable and Video Format are set correctly.




8) Once Auto Scan is complete, select the Channels icon. You will see your numerical Channel Lineup. Highlight each channel, Right Click and rename by Broadcaster.



9) Your channels will now be listed by the Channel Number and Broadcaster.




10) Once Auto Scan is complete, close out the Channel Suite Manager. Then, Left Click on the Small Space Bar(between the channel selector buttons) to view your available TV Channel Lineup.




1) To begin encoding from your CATV Channel Lineup, select the TV Guide.



2) Once your TV Guide opens, select the program you would like to encode and Left Click.



3) A Program Detail Screen will pop up with details of the broadcast. Select Record to automatically add your encode request to the Program Scheduler. These details will be copied later (see page 17).



 To View Programs Scheduled for Encoding from CATV, open the Program Scheduler on your Desktop.




5) Once open, you will see the Program Name, Run Time, Channel and Duration.




6) To manually schedule a specific Braodcast for encoding, select Add Program




7) The Add Program window will open. There, you will select the channel, Time To Begin, Program Duration and Date To Begin. You can schedule it for One Time Only, Everyday, and Weekly. Once all information is entered, select Set Program.




8) Your Program Scheduler will list all scheduled encoding events.



1) Right Click the Small Space Bar. Your Channel Manager will appear.



2) Choose Zenith VCR or DVD as your media input source.




3) Manually press the Play Button on your VCR/DVD player.



4) To Start Encoding, select the Red Dot.



5) Once the selection is finished encoding, it saves the file to C://My Videos Folder. Files indicate Media Source, Date, Random ID Number. (ie: _Zenith VCR_20070821_161531)




6) To View your selection close the Encoder + Source Selector.

Then select Encoded Video File Player.




7) Once the Encoded Video File Player opens, select Add a New File.



8) Select the Video you would like to play, then Open.




9) Select the Play button located at the bottom of the screen.




10) If you approve the encoding quality, Please proceed to next section, Transferring MPEG Files to the VOD Server.


1) Open your Internet browser. In the Web Address Bar type the IP Address of the MediaMaster Server. Please save this to your Favorites or create a Shortcut.




2) Once you are logged into MediaMaster please select the MM Administrator Tab.



3) Select Titles, then select Add New Title




4) Add the Title of the selection including a Subject, Author and Description of video. Change Type to Digital Video. Once all information is complete select Add.




Rembember, the better your description the easier for teachers to search.


5) Once the video is added select the new title you just entered. The Edit Title screen will open.




6) Once the Edit Title screen is open make sure all your information is entered correctly. Select the Attach DV File.




7) You then select the digitized Video you just encoded and select Open.



8) After you select open you will see a Digital Video Upload screen pop up.




9) Once the Video is uploaded select Close on the Edit Title Screen. Congratulations, your video is now in the Media Title Data Base on the VOD Server!




1) Log onto WWW.PBS.ORG, the select PBS Teachers.




2) Once you are on the PBS Teachers page select the Log In Button at the top of the page.




3) Once you have logged in select Create a New Profile.




4) Provide your email address and password for your new account.




5) Provide the zip code of your area to receive the local channel listings




6) Select your preferred PBS channel.
